# Club des Guides

Situated in the heart of Brussels' European Quarter, the Club des Guides is a place where tradition and conviviality come together in a distinctive and elegant setting. Housed in a nineteenth-century neoclassical townhouse on Rue d'Arlon, just steps from Place du Luxembourg, the building still retains the atmosphere of a private club, with period interiors, paintings and decorative details that evoke its long connection to the Belgian cavalry.



For well over a century, this address has been associated with the officers of the 1st Regiment of Guides, first as their mess and later as a club created to preserve the regiment's presence in Brussels.

Over the years, the Club has continued to maintain its heritage and traditions. Today, it brings together around 300 members, including past and current officers of the Guides, and stands out as a lively and characterful venue in the city: a place of memory, but also of encounter, discussion and hospitality, where historical identity continues to coexist with contemporary use.

# Transport

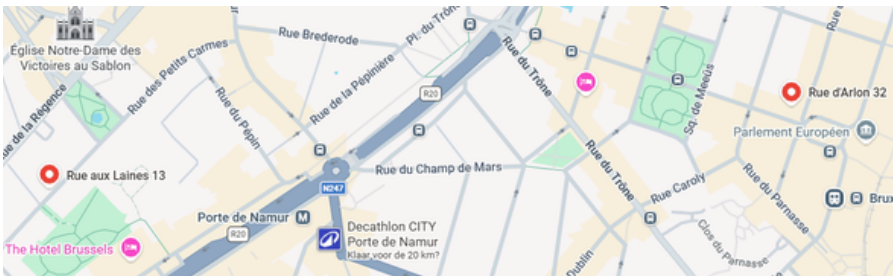
This year General Assembly's venues are located close to one another and can easily be reached on foot, by metro, bus or taxi.

The nearest **metro** stations are Maalbeek and Schuman, both served by metro lines 1 and 5.

The closest metro station to the Hôtel de Lannoy is Louise (Louiza), served by metro lines 2 and 6 and located just a 7-minute walk from the venue.

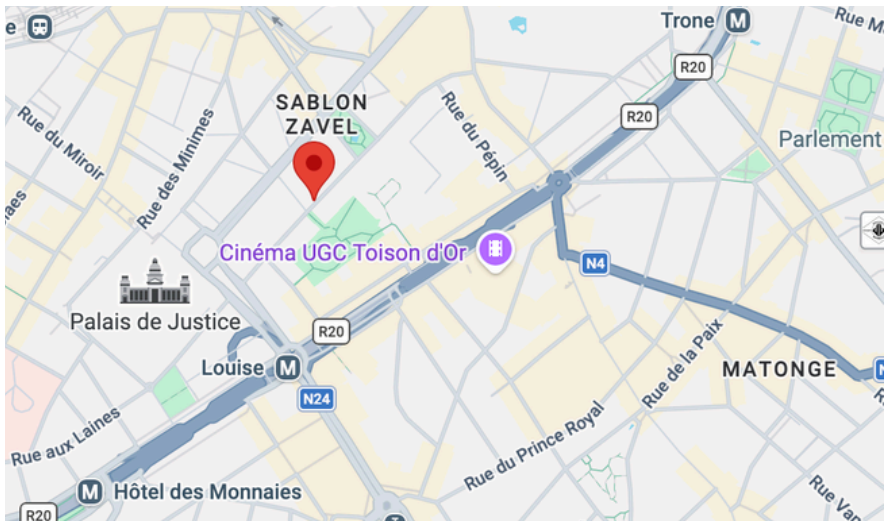

# Hôtel de Lannoy

Located in the heart of the elegant Sablon district, the Hôtel de Lannoy stands in one of Brussels' most refined and evocative neighborhoods. Built in 1762, the palace was acquired a few years later by Count Dominique-Alexandre d'Epinoÿ. In 1833, it passed into the hands of the Lannoy family when Count Gustave de Lannoy acquired it, and it remains their residence to this day. During the early twentieth century, the building was carefully restored and enlarged by the architect Octave Flanneau, who added remarkable architectural features such as Louis XV-style salons, a grand staircase, a courtyard, and a garden. Major parts of the building were officially listed in 2001 as historic monuments by the Brussels-Capital Region.
